Hands-on experience with basic shop tools, measuring instruments, fasteners, lifting devices, and electrical wiring techniques. Emphasis on safety, accuracy, and the professional use of shop tools and diagnostic equipment, preparing students for the workplace.

General Course Objectives

Upon successful completion of this course, students will be able to:

- Demonstrate proper shop safety, PPE, and OSHA-compliant procedures.
- Safely operate forklifts and lifting devices for material handling and vehicle movement.
- Identify and correctly use fasteners, threads, and torque specifications.
- Accurately measure components using micrometers, calipers, and other precision tools.
- Perform thread repair, tapping, and bolt extraction procedures.
- Properly crimp, solder, and repair electrical wiring connections.
- Use mechanical pullers, presses, and bearing tools correctly and safely.
- Identify and assemble common hydraulic fittings and hoses to specification.
- Demonstrate professionalism, teamwork, and shop organization.
