Assessment, Dental Hygiene Diagnosis, Treatment Planning, Implementation, Evaluation, Documentation	1. Obtain, review, and update a complete medical, dental, and personal history including assessment of vital signs. 2. Perform a comprehensive extra/intraoral examination using periodontal and dental examinations, radiographs, indices, and other data collection procedures to assess the patient's needs. 3. Recognize predisposing and etiological risk factors that require intervention to prevent disease (i.e., caries, tobacco, systemic diseases). 4. Establish and prioritize a treatment plan based on analyzing and interpreting data assessment and the dental hygiene diagnosis. 5. Obtain the patient's written informed consent based on a thorough case presentation. 6. Follow accepted infection control procedures within compliance with OSHA and the CDC. 7. Perform dental hygiene interventions to eliminate and/or control local etiologic factors to prevent and control caries, periodontal disease, and other oral conditions. Dental hygiene interventions include, but are not limited to the following: periodontal debridement scaling, application of chemotherapeutic agents, fluoride therapy, selective polishing, health education and preventive counseling, nutritional counseling related to oral and systemic health, application of pit and fissure sealants, care of oral prostheses, and care and maintenance of restorations. 8. Control pain and anxiety during treatment through use of accepted clinical and behavioral techniques including nitrous oxide sedation, local and topical anesthetic, and the use of subgingival anesthetic ointment (i.e. Oraqix). 9. Determine if local anesthetic or nitrous oxide sedation is required in order to control pain and behavioral anxiety during treatment. 10. Determine the outcomes of dental hygiene interventions using indices and re-evaluation of oral and periodontal health status. 11. Determine subsequent treatment needs and continuing care (recall) intervals and inform the patient. 12. Provide patients with a written summary of their treatment and referral information. 13. Evaluate patient satisfaction with the treatment they received. 14. Produce complete and accurate recording of patient assessment information using paper/computer. 15. Record information pertaining to patient verbal interactions. 16. Record information pertaining to patient assessment data including indices. 17. Record information on paper/computer pertaining to patient treatment provided.	7.5	0	180

Provide appropriate life support measures for medical emergencies that may be encountered in dental hygiene practice. 23.
